



SEMI-ANNUAL POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS REPORT

Reporting Period: January 1 – June 30, 2022

The success of Exelon Corporation (including its subsidiaries, “Exelon”) depends on sound public policies at the national, state, and local levels. Political contributions are made to candidates or organizations to promote sound energy, economic and environmental policies that address needs of our customers, communities, and other stakeholders, create value for our investors, and are aligned with Exelon’s values. We recognize, however, that we may not agree with every position taken by the candidates and organizations to which we contribute.

Consistent with our commitment to ethical business conduct, our policies prohibit contributions made to improperly influence or reward, or in exchange for, an official act, and require that contributions reflect the interests of the Company without regard for the private political preferences of individual officers, directors, or employees.

This report includes a listing of political contributions¹ made by Exelon and its subsidiaries for the above-noted reporting period, pursuant to Exelon’s Corporate Political Contributions Policy (the “Policy”). In the interest of transparency for our shareholders and stakeholders, Exelon also posts its Corporate Political Contributions Policy on our website. This report is reviewed by the Corporate Governance Committee of the Exelon Board of Directors semi-annually.

Compliance with State & Federal Law

Exelon’s political contributions guidelines require compliance with all federal, state, and local laws as well as reporting requirements governing corporate political contributions. Federal law prohibits corporations from making contributions to candidates for federal office. State and local laws dictate the conditions under which corporate political contributions can be made.

Political Action Committees (PACs)

Exelon and its subsidiaries have several bipartisan PACs that are funded solely through voluntary employee contributions. These PACs offer eligible employees a direct means to voluntarily participate in shaping public policy and expressing views on issues related to our business. Exelon provides limited administrative support to each PAC. The disclosures in this report *do NOT include* contributions made by any of Exelon’s PACs. ¹ For purposes of this report, “political contribution” includes gifts or transfers of money or property to (a) a candidate, or candidate for nomination, for election to public office in any governmental unit, (b) an entity or association (including a political party, political committee, political action committee, or an entity organized under 26 U.S.C. §527) organized for the purpose of nominating or electing a person to a public office in any Governmental Unit, or obtaining a vote on an issue included in a referendum or ballot measure, (c) an entity organized and operating under 26 U.S.C. §501(c)(4) if the contribution is provided for the purpose of political activities, and (d) a special contribution to a non-profit organization for the purpose of funding political activity (i.e., supporting or opposing a candidate for nomination or election to public office or a referendum) incidental to another primary purpose.
